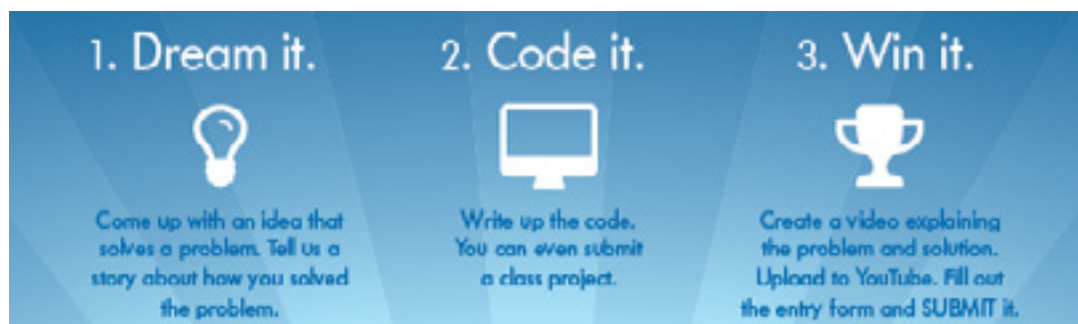


Dream it. Code it. Win it.

Third Annual Student Coding Competition May 5, 2016 - \$80,000 in Cash and Prizes

Dream it. Code it. Win it. has been organized by the **MIT Enterprise Forum of NYC, MIT Club of New York** and event underwriter, **Fiverr**, to celebrate and reward creativity in computer science.

In 2015, the contest won four awards and two in the previous year, reached 45 countries, and enabled eight teams in total to start companies. In addition, women made up the majority of the diverse applicant pool. Students won \$150,000 in total over the past two years in prizes for creations that ranged from robotics to web pages.



How Can Students Participate?

- All college teams submitting entries for the monetary prizes must be 18 years or older and enrolled as full time students at an accredited institution.
- Students submitting entries for the [High School Award](#) will need to be represented by a sponsor that is 18 years or older. The sponsor can be a parent, teacher or mentor who is authorized to represent the students. Signed parental or guardian consent forms will be required from each team member.
- Students can enter individually or as a team and submit already existing applications, school projects, or they can create something entirely new!

What Are the Criteria For Winning?

- Submissions must be made through the submissions page by April 3, 2016, at midnight.
- All submissions will be judged based on the creativity applied to solving using computer science.
- Submissions may include, but are not limited to: phone apps, web pages providing a service, robotics, hardware, or a technology tool.
- A one to two minute video must be included in the submissions, which details the following:
 - the student or team's name
 - the project's name
 - a brief overview of the problem in solves
 - how it is used (demo)
